**VIRUS DELAYS FEB. EDITION:** A virus which originated from a San Diego County government-owned Nonprofit Organization website delayed the February edition of this newspaper. No mailings were contagious. Additional firewalls are now in use. Do you think DA Summer Stephan will prosecute San Diego County, her employer? More recently my mailboxes were hacked, sending out an advertisement for an on-line news service. Story above.

It gets back to what we always say: **There are three ways to make money in San Diego:** #1, Sell Dope. #2, Rent Real Estate. #3, Start a Nonprofit Organization to deal with the victims of #1 and #2.

## NEW NAZI CAMERAS:

The new cameras on San Diego's street lights are the largest surveillance installation in the history of the planet Earth, and there is unlikely to be any investigation into bribery, except by the news media. How about a voter referendum as to whether or not they should be removed? One way, we become **"America's Nazi City"**, taking a page right out of Adolph Hitler's book "Mein Kampf", and the other way we become **"America's Stupidest City"**, a city that spent \$30 million with the inability of the public to comment in advance, and a deception on the part of the Mayor and City Council, calling the cameras "Sensor Nodes". ## NEWS MEDIA NEWS:

This section deals with both poverty and the news media at the same time. It often airs concerns which are taboo in the conventional media.

**Four Mexican Journalists were killed** in the first two weeks of March, one of them from one of my old stomping grounds, where Arizona, California, and Mexico all meet. That is the (one) community of Winterhaven, Bard, Yuma, and San Luis Rio Colorado. Since then, Mexican Journalists have taken to the streets, protesting with picket signs, as a lot of the evidence points to the Mexican government. One of the men arrested was a Journalist who has apparently murdered one of his competitors. You think it's tough in the United States? When Pope Francis was asked to leave Mexico because of cohabitation with a young boy, Journalists were threatened with death if they told about same. He is just the man to conquer the Priest Pedophilia problem.

Excellent article by **Gary Warth**, San Diego Union-Tribune, Page B-1, Sunday, March 3, "Homeless Funding Up, But Showers Still Closed", about how the Neil Good Center for the Homeless should be open 24 hours, and provide laundry, shower, and toilet services at all times, too. It is a priority in preventing San Diego's estimated 300+ homeless suicides every year. Most suicides are listed as accident or disease related, but they are from refusing to see a doctor when sick, or refusing to get out of the way of a large truck. This is known in Homeless Advocacy as "Indirect" Suicide. The U-T website will not allow a link. Perhaps the title of the article was changed.

Excellent article by **David Garrick**, also in the San Diego Union-Tribune, Page B-1, March 8, "City Aims For More Granny Flats", a program to increase housing by adding apartments to existing homes. In addition to streamlining applications and reducing fees, the City and its Housing Commission will provide pre-blueprinted and pre-approved architectural plans. This so-called "Affordable" Housing, **that only well-paid professionals can afford**, would go to lawyers, dentists, business executives and other professionals who currently must live in Lower-Class housing because of San Diego having nearly NO Middle-Class housing at this time. Professionals moving out of Lower-Class housing into this new "Affordable" Housing will free up Lower-Class housing for Lower-Class people to use.

This reduces homelessness in San Diego. Unfortunately, this may take ten years to produce an additional ten thousand apartments, and San Diego will (at current rates) have more than ten thousand additional homeless ten years from now, a net gain of zero on abating homelessness. Still, the else is to have at least ten thousand more homeless on our streets, ten years from now. Good plan. Here, the City Council's Chris Ward is actually making a difference instead of just talking about making a difference, and even super-conservative Scott Sherman is on board.

Excellent article by **Seth Combs**, San Diego CityBeat, March 27, "Who's really afraid of rent control?" giving the real story of the national real estate cartels and how they create homelessness. He quotes the United Nations as saying that the Blackstone Group is "wreaking havoc" by fueling the housing crisis. Oregon now has statewide rent control, which Combs insists is "part of any solution". We agree. If your rent were tripled or quintupled would you be homeless? **Time for the Governor and State Legislature to have tough laws that deal with rent control, state-wide, tightly-controlled, with certain options that cities or counties can opt out of.** Rents are so high now that businesses are going out of business (including newspapers) because **nobody has money for anything except their rent.** Moving back in with your parents at age 35 or 45 is now the norm, not the exception, but it's too depressing for most to write about. In a pinch, consider Tijuana.

Excellent article by **Matt Potter**, San Diego Reader, City Lights, page 29, March 21 edition, "Cash to coach helps Kimmel's kids into college", about the university enrollment scam involving the former owner of KFMB Radio and Television (News 8) including the accusation of unlawful political contributions of-kind that involved the political use of the broadcast stations in ways prohibited by the FCC. Elizabeth Kimmel is also accused by Federal Prosecutors of laundering money using a Nonprofit Organization, the Meyer Charitable Foundation. Isn't money laundering what Nonprofit Organizations do for a living?

The same schools caught up in the **"Pay to Enroll" scandal** sell rich folks copies of all the exams, in advance, to give to their children enrolled there. In the end, these kids grow up to become the "Unnecessary Professionals" that are hired to be Housing Navigators, navigating the ONE piece of housing that becomes available to homeless folks every year in San Diego. USD is one of the scam schools and is run by the Jesuits, just like Father Joe's Villages. They found 50 people housing? Only if you consider mental hospitals or Nazi death camps to be "housing". We consider Father Joe's to be one of the Private Prisons that we are trying to eliminate. The worst one is PATH, Perpetrators Ass-kicking the Homeless (Persons Assisting the Homeless), which was so awful in Skid Row Los Angeles that hundreds of Journalists and Editors tried to block their moving here. We called them a Mormon Prison to torture poor people, part of the Nazi Stalag System, for prisoners of war caught in the Class Warfare struggle. In the end, this newspaper was born of the struggle to keep Los Angeles Skid Row out of the San Diego

Bottoms Ghetto. San Diego prides itself as being way better, at everything, than Los Angeles.

Excellent article by **Gary Warth**, San Diego Union-Tribune, March 9, "Councilman Pushes to Re-open Showers for the Homeless", about **Chris Ward** and his plans to re-open showers at the Neil Good Homeless Center. 24/7 showers and laundromat services are important because homeless are down on the ground and get **urinated on by dogs** 24 hours and are **often also pooped on**. Conventional newspapers cannot say things like that directly, so you are reading the rest of that here. Have a nice, shit-free day. Things like flush toilets and downtown showers might reduce homeless suicides from 330 per year (best estimate) to only 200 or less. This does not help the 4 to 6 thousand who died from being homeless in the past 20 years, but it is a start. Every year San Diego tears down 1,000 low-cost rentals, but only ends up with 650 new homeless, because 350 die every year from being homeless.

**If you are homeless in San Diego you are 30 times more likely to DIE than find housing (other than shelters). That's a fact and we're sticking with it.**

**Gary Warth's** March 11 article, "Arrests of Homeless Doubled in January" does correctly state that **homeless in jail are not counted** in the official count of the homeless. The latest precise data we have is from 2017 when 2,600 homeless ( $\pm$  20) in jail were interviewed before caseworkers and the media were denied access to them. **Each year as many as 35% of the 7,500 sidewalk homeless are arrested in the months leading up to the count, for 30 years running now.** Good article, but exact numbers only confuse people with things that are "Technically True" but NOT "Functionally True". This stuff is used by spin-doctors like the Mayor to tell lies that are misleading truths. Anyway, 30-year trends do not need to get picky with exact numbers. Ticketing of the homeless DID double near the count time. This was purely a well-planned coincidence. It is not good policy because it reduces how much HUD federal funding San Diego gets. The reason there is a conspiracy to lie about San Diego's 39,000 homeless number is that we have the largest % number of homeless anywhere in the world, if you use the real figure.

**Number One in Homelessness, America's Homeless City, is not something to brag about. New York City is 32 times the size of San Diego, but we have more homeless, truth be told.**

Thanks to **Mike Madriga**, **San Diego Reader**, for his homeless article "North Park residents patrol the neighborhood", March 21, which speaks about homeowners packing guns. They are also organizing a Crime Watch. It is not only important that the views of homeless folks come out in the open, but also the views of homeowners. Helps drive home the point of how horrific the impact of homelessness is, not only for the homeless but also for the homeowners. We need to blame our civic leaders for allowing this problem to materialize the past 50 years and become our largest local problem the last 20 years. Once all apartments and rooms rent for more money than Minimum Wage pays, people become homeless. Then, they gradually develop habits of using alcohol, then drugs, and finally they become mentally ill. After that, they usually kill themselves. All that from just the price of housing. The Los Angeles Mormon Mafia, a real estate cartel as ferocious as the drug cartels, made a billion dollars a week "Redeveloping" real estate here to replace reasonable rents with million-dollar condos. This out-priced nearly everyone. Should the homeless also be packing guns? I hope not. Historically, going back to the homeless Christians burning Rome, Arson becomes the norm when clashes occur between homeowners and the homeless. What we need now is 22,000 low-priced rental units to replace the \$20-per-week units that were torn down. The new units can rent for \$35 a week, but not \$450 per WEEK as currently. Paradise became hell, including for homeowners. The homeless never gentrified San Diego, so don't blame us. Like the homeowners, we are victims.

**PORTIONS OF THIS ARTICLE WHICH WERE ORIGINALLY CENSORED OUT:** 50 years of Propaganda in the news media blaming the homeless for being homeless is almost an insurmountable obstacle to getting anything done. The same gangsters who run the real estate cartels also run the drug cartels and have ties to the news media. Welcome to San Diego. We find homeless people housing in some other state, but what about homeowners? In Detroit, homelessness resulted in armed confrontations and Arson, causing about one-third of all homes to be abandoned at this time. You get money if you are willing to own them. San Diego needs 22,000 low-rent apartments, not mental hospitals, not prisons, not drug rehabilitation centers,

not concentration camps, not shelters, HOUSING. No, the back seat of a Chevrolet is NOT housing.

In the **San Diego Reader**, March 21, "Containing the Homeless", page 6, **Julie Stalmer**, Neighborhood News, tells of the use of shipping containers to build apartments. The original idea goes back many years, and was the proposal of San Diego City Councilman Floyd Morrow. The plan was never approved here, but his company built units that helped end the homeless problem in Tijuana, and he still owns many of the U.S. Patents on all that. From there, Logan Heights is not an appropriate location. And, the comment that PATH somehow helps the homeless is absurd. PATH of Skid Row Los Angeles was so awful a place that every homeless intellectual tried to stop having one of those in San Diego. "Seeking to end the cycle of Homelessness"? How about Seeking to make as much money as possible on a problem? They establish torture-prisons to make money on the homeless problem without solving it. They were the reason this newspaper exists, to try to minimize suffering and wasted tax money. We called the facility a Mormon Prison. Tearing down all the cheap housing results in people living on the sidewalk. That leads to heroin addiction, which leads to lots of needles everywhere. It also leads to huge profits for dope dealers. There is not enough money to treat everyone in San Diego who was forced to become homeless.

I sometimes write about the Hitler-camps, such as in the above article, so I am impressed at the **Gary Warth** San Diego Union-Tribune article "Harsh Conditions Discovered in City-Owned Family Shelter", Front page (A-1) March 16. It is about YWCA, one of our many **For Profit** Nonprofits. Just like "Affordable Housing" is not affordable, the Nonprofits make a lot of money that they tax-shelter. Nonprofits not only pay no taxes but are also allowed 10% profit. At the time those tax laws were drawn up, For-Profit corporations only made about 15%. This Hitler-Camp for families with children is owned by the City's Real Estate Assets Dept. San Diego in the Hitler business.

**Peter Rowe** writes "Homeless, but a million-dollar view", SD Union-Tribune, front page, March 17, an excellent article about camping. I wrote a published book on all forms of camping, including backpacking, also making the point that if you ever find yourself without housing, this is one option to have a home.

**Gary Warth** writes March 20, San Diego Union-Tribune, Page B-1, "SD Council Oks Golden Hall for Temporary Homeless Use". We suggested that over 10 years ago and before that in Yahoo! News.

**Warth** also writes "Library's new homeless approach", Sun. Apr. 7, page B-2, which is the best article so far on the interaction between librarians and homeless. I write more about this near the end of "Meetings".

In **CityBeat**, March 20, **Andrea Lopez Villafaño** writes, "Storage Wars, Episode 2: Broken Promises" about the current battle over homeless storage. Great article, but this is more like Episode 623 on that issue, beginning around 1980, getting ridiculous about 1990, and finally reached its peak via a lawsuit around 2008. San Diego intentionally lured homeless into a free meal, made them keep all of their possessions outside, locked the doors, and then stole everything these folks owned, burying it all deep in a landfill. People lost the burial urns of their parents or grandparents, family photo albums, manuscripts of songs and movies they wrote, their medicines, everything, even their clothing. Besides paying more than 200 people cash damages, San Diego had to provide storage for homeless possessions, too. Your tax money in action, paying legal damages.

The original storage plans were those used by Los Angeles Skid Row, and these plans absolutely failed there, also being tried and failed in many other cities. Then-Mayor Jerry Sanders wanted to make storage fail, selecting a plan that failed everywhere it was tried. However, the Isaiah Project headed by Water Man David Ross actually got the plan to succeed in San Diego. There has been a storage facility ever since. In the article the Mayor's Press Secretary is quoted as saying 50 people "found housing". Was that mental hospitals, Nazi concentration camps, or prisoner-of-war Class Warfare camps? There is no housing available unless you define that word to include being housed in the back seat of a Buick. The search for a new homeless storage facility now continues over 50 years since it began and still there are delays. Call me back in another 25 years and we will talk about holding a meeting since we are nearing a solution. The Lincoln Club does not want storage, and they pay the money to get folks elected. We could use a storage center at the new skydiving building at 14<sup>th</sup> and Imperial, so that homeless can temporarily store their things and use the library across the street. We need homeless storage elsewhere? We do, but the Mormon Godfather and

his Real Estate Cartel will not permit it. Organized Crime made this take 50 years and can make it take another 50. Welcome to San Diego. Now, go back to Utah.

## Other News:

MEXICO UPDATE WAS CENSORED OUT. It deals with **many dead Journalists**, the use of Investigative Journalists to find out those culpable, and the results pointing to the police, and government, and also other competing Journalists. What a mess! For example, all Mexican Journalists know that Pope Francis was asked to leave Mexico for co-habitation with a young boy. Those who talked about it were executed. He is just the guy to solve the Priest Pedophilia problem.

Regarding the **closure of certain City Parks** overnight, that probably violates the Federal Court Order that **San Diego will make all city property available for the homeless to sleep on**. In the past, San Diego said its parks belong to the Park Conservancy, but the courts ruled that is part of San Diego, too.

**Donald Trump** is better at destroying evidence than anyone realized. The Mueller Report does not exonerate him, just says that the Trump Justice Dept. has refused to cooperate and turn over evidence. What about the 8 workers for the Democratic National Committee who were murdered just before the 2016 Primary and none of their clandestine KGB-type deaths were investigated? **Vivian Moreno**, whose politics once worried me, is doing a fine job, and her latest work of genius is to insert a time limit on coming up with a plan for homeless storage. Lawmakers have until June, about 2 months, or the approval to extend the Sherman Heights homeless storage facility is to be permanently cancelled. Sherman Heights makes no sense for a storage facility because it lacks the 300-or-so needed things that can be accessed downtown but not elsewhere. **The ONLY reason homeless are downtown is that they do not have transportation and downtown has everything within walking distance.** Meals 3 times a day, multiple food pantries, Balboa Park, chiropractors, mental health facilities, liquor stores, drug abatement programs, massive transit connections, DMV, SSI, SSDI, government offices, the law library, the downtown library, lots of fast-food restaurants, and even access to tourists to beg money.

The City removed toilets, showers, and laundry facilities in order to NOT have all features downtown. We are stuck with downtown and its awful smells, sidewalk shit, biting dogs, traffic and construction noise, overcrowding, what a wretched place. Shall we move Balboa Park to Scripps Ranch? Ah, now you see the problem. Be thankful you don't know these things firsthand. I do, which is why you're reading me instead of me reading you.

## Meetings:

The **Basic Dignity Coalition** met Thursday, March 7, 6 PM, per usual, at the Moniker Warehouse on 16th and G in San Diego. There were 23 present, about double the average number for this time of year, especially in the wet and cold weather. This was the **111th** meeting of this group in the past ten years, and an almost completely different crowd than last meeting was present. **www.ThinkDignity.Org.**


Last month had about 2,100 storage bin check-ins at the 16th St. Storage Center. All bins are in use. • Community advocates were heard from regarding **MTS passes for the disabled** being refused by MTS if they deal with mental illnesses. NCTD in North County will still issue a Disabled Pass for a Mental Disability, but you need to go to Oceanside for that. **NCTD disabled passes are valid on MTS.** The current pass system screening for S/D/M passes used by MTS probably violates HIPAA, so an inquiry was made about possibly suing MTS under HIPAA. • There was no RTFH (**Regional Task Force on the Homeless**) governing board meeting in January nor in February, and their by-laws were changed to now require only 4 meetings per year. It was confirmed that the SD Police arrested many homeless the day before the annual PITC (Point-In-Time Count) so that

they would not be on the sidewalk and instead in jail. **This skewed the count to 2,500 less homeless than actual.** Nonetheless, the count was up this year. The San Diego Unified School District uses a different definition of Homeless, and that results in about **23,000 homeless** in San Diego County. This **does not include the 16,000 Secret Homeless** that hide from everyone. If we add both figures, San Diego has 39,000 homeless and will reach 40,000 by the end of 2019. These are actual best-information-available numbers. The PITC is used because it shows the fewest number of homeless, about 9,000, ignoring the other 30,000. The bottom line is that San Diego has the largest **percentage** of homeless in the world, if the REAL numbers are used, instead of the Fake Count numbers. Yes, there are more homeless in New York, by a slight amount, but New York City is 32 times the size of San Diego. Ditto for Los Angeles, but it is 12 times the size of San Diego. If we use the 39,000 (REAL) figure, San Diego is number one in the number of homeless, worldwide, even including Palestine.

**Legal action considered** by this group includes possibly forcing San Diego County under **Project 100** (P-100) to cease **massive privacy invasions** when people apply for benefits, including surprise abusive visits that tear apart the homes of poor people, looking for drugs, weapons, money, valuables, even artwork or jewelry, which might make them not eligible for Welfare or even Food Stamps. I gave the testimonial of once having applied for Food Stamps and the horrific things that were done to me. I sued San Diego County and won Triple Damages. I was forced to work 4 hours per day at fifty cents per hour, paid in Food Stamps alone. **If you are having trouble securing benefits that you are entitled to, speak up. These things are a violation of your Civil Rights. Contact info@ACLUSanDiego.Org.**

**Think Dignity** had a **Career Faire** April 2, 1-4 PM, at the San Diego Downtown Library, Ninth Floor. They also just added two new shower sites. The free food Street Cafe will be changing locations. Next meeting is April 4, 6 PM, at the Moniker Warehouse, downtown (East Village) San Diego. **www.ThinkDignity.Org.** ♦♦♦♦ The next article is also about this group.

**The same group also met April 4,** with a record number of 29 present, the only meeting with more being the first meeting, ten years ago, 31. A lot of government folks present, as well as leaders of nonprofits. This was the 112<sup>th</sup> meeting of this group. The group included 4 homeless, 2 attorneys, 2 press, and 2 children. • **March recap:** The Street Boutique, a van which gives away underwear and hygiene items, appeared in Uptown for the first time. The Career Faire at the downtown library found many employment and was a tremendous success. 2 new shower sites were added. • **Kyra Bethel**, Program Manager for **Dreams For Change** (free parking for those sleeping in cars) spoke: They also have free income tax preparation, a workforce development program teaching people to start their own food trucks, and life skills programs, as well as case management. They offer immediate food truck self-employment at \$11.50 per hour as an Independent Contractor (not an employee). They also have personal finance training, conflict resolution training, and mental health help. They recently applied for a federal grant. Note that you can become part of their Safe Parking Program without having to receive these other services. • **Jennifer Jenkins**, Supervising Librarian, and **Monnee Tong**, Manager of Sciences, both from the **San Diego Central Library**, spoke of their new knowledge acquired about homelessness. It has frequently been pointed out by the Homeless Editorial Board that libraries are where intelligent homeless hang out (the ones who have never been counted or interviewed), just like the not-so-intelligent homeless hang out at recycling yards. They spoke of free library events and a new "Partner Services Desk", legal clinic, healthcare 211 referrals, mental health services, and more. They are teaching how to be empathetic to un-housed visitors. • **Olivia Kealy from Crowd Rise**, part of **Go Fund Me**, spoke of how they raised \$5 billion for medical emergencies out of \$390 billion total raised in 2017. The Salvation Army got \$65,000 in just 24 hours. She is looking for more participants to start campaigns. • **Summer Survival Distribution** of free stuff like sunscreen and swimwear, as well as bug repellent, is scheduled for the end of June or first part of July. • **On Wed., April 17, a committee of the San Diego City Council will hear Mayor Faulconer's new plan to restrict homeless parking, 9 AM, 12<sup>th</sup> floor of San Diego City Hall, Civic Center Trolley Stop, 3<sup>rd</sup> and C. See headline of this edition.** • Next meeting of the Basic Dignity Coalition, May 2.



## SALADODOLOGY 101 (From Front Page)

All salad dressings that are common are also simple. Mayonnaise, for example, is vegetable oil with egg yolk added to make it whip up like whipped cream. Tartar sauce is mayo plus pickle relish. So, of course, if you add catsup to tartar sauce, you get 1000 Island dressing. Barbecue sauce is catsup with liquid smoke (such as Wright's or Colgin's), and from there you can add mustard, sugar, brown sugar, honey, cloves, even tomato sauce. BBQ sauce is multi-cultural, sort of like chili. You can make your own mayonnaise by putting egg yolks in a blender, turning it on its highest setting, and gradually adding vegetable oil. Need to thicken something? Use mashed potato flakes. You can even thicken pancake syrup or rice pudding this way. Be careful, though, because 2 thickenings occur. The first one is as soon as you add the flakes. Then, 2 minutes later there is a chemical reaction via the potato starch. Wait 2 minutes for the stuff to stiffen each time you add more potato flakes. Catalina French dressing, also called California French, is catsup with vegetable oil, or with a little bit of mayo. Potato salad has sliced potatoes, finely chopped celery, mayo, and pickle relish. Optional boiled eggs and mustard. Cole slaw is shredded cabbage and carrot, pickle relish, with either vinegar-and-oil or creamy (mayo). Caraway seeds and/or crushed pineapple are a nice touch. Italian dressing? Vinegar with either salad oil or mayo, with optional finely-chopped bell pepper, onion, garlic, and/or black peppercorns. • Always have a few packages of mayonnaise on hand, because if you develop head lice, mayo will suffocate them. That immediately stops itching, and you can then go to a health clinic for more medicine and a lice comb. Sorry, but that's the use of salad dressing to cure disease. Important street knowledge.
