Solutions:

Making the homeless abatement plans work, causing the fewest problems for homeowners and businesses.

1. Make HOT, the Homeless Outreach Team, part of the fire dept., not the police dept.
2. Open the Neil Good Center 24/7 with hot showers, flush toilets, drinking water, and laundry services at all times.
3. Permit the homeless to camp in designated campgrounds in the rural areas of the city.
4. A well-constructed Vehicle Habitation and Parking plan could eliminate many problems at no cost. It may need to list every address legal or illegal to park at.
5. Daily hot meals need to exist in every City Council district, and so do homeless possessions storage facilities, 24/7 hot showers, flush toilets, and laundry facilities.
6. The involvement of churches and religions needs to be minimal to prevent psychological damage, especially along the lines of abuse of Human Spirituality, hypnosis, and Socialization. Religious abuse causes loss of the will to live, suicides, mental castration, mental illnesses, inability to concentrate, lack of focus, ADD/ADHD, and severe Clinical Depression.
7. The current practice of spending \$300,000 on each person housed is not tenable, especially considering the homeless population is 35,500, not a mere 8,000 as in the annual FAKE count. Instead we need Tiny Homes (Tiny Houses), campgrounds, trailer parks, apartments, and similar.
8. Outreach Harassment needs to be minimized, not doubled, to cut down on the number of suicides, both Direct and Indirect. We may now see 600 instead of 300 per year, under the new city budget.
9. If the city and county were to abandon its present ass-backwards ways of dealing with a real estate problem called homelessness, a lot more progress could be made for everyone, not just the homeless.
10. If the Democrats on the city council were to rule by veto override, a lot more could be accomplished, instead of the NOTHING that has been done since the elections 8 months ago.
11. We homeless have failed, too. We failed to get many in the news media to start telling the truth about San Diego's homeless problem. We failed to educate public officials and their staffs on how homelessness works, and what makes it continue. I personally lost interest when Donald Trump used voting machine re-programming to fraudulently become President. It was recently revealed that voting machines contain cell phones in their circuits, which can be connected

to the internet. They are manufactured to be easy to hack. Who knew? Since Trump, there are the additional problems of Fake News, awful medical care, massive economic Inflation, a bad economy that has good economic indicators, less money to deal with poverty, and increased city and county propaganda. How do you take all this on at the same time? We now have fewer toilets, showers, meals, and parks usable for sleeping. Even our local police have become radicalized and would rather kill someone than arrest them. How can this be dealt with? Protests? I doubt it.

Would any of this help attract more police to work here?
13. Convert the indoor skydiving facility at 13th and Imperial to a homeless possessions storage facility, with also temporary storage while using the downtown library. 1,000 storage units, open 24/7, with hot showers, flush toilets, and laundry services at all hours. ••

San Diego "City to hire 9 to assist homeless", excellent article by Gary Warth, San Diego Union-Tribune, June 10, Page B-1. Useless Housing

Navigators will help drain money from our "Homeless Help Scam" by looking for more housing that isn't there. Only 12% currently get housing, and that "housing" is mental hospitals and drug rehabilitation clinics. The Housing Commission is still ignoring good advice that it paid for several years ago, indicating the need for far fewer humans and more computers to do the work. I will look through my files to identify the exact report, paid for by the Regional Task Force, and done by a world-renowned business services agency. Instead of moving forward, San Diego's ship of homeless and housing services is going in reverse and will eventually run aground, crashing into the dock. It is the Housing Commission and Regional Task Force on the Homeless that need housing managers, to help them see reality. Thanks to Gary Warth for inspiring a meaningful editorial. ••

Jennifer Van Grove writes about the San Diego City "Council votes to cut ties with Civic San Diego", SD Union-Tribune, June 5, front page (A-1). Centre City Development Corp (1975) became Civic San Diego in 2012 when the State outlawed Redevelopment funded by the State. These two agencies are responsible for 100% of San Diego's homeless problems per a lengthy Federal lawsuit and the determinations of the Court. During this time, only billionaire housing was approved, while removing all of the low-cost housing as "blighted". The City collected fees from developers to deal with housing the homeless, but only collected 10% of the amount required to do that. Since the blame is being transferred from the City Council to the City Council, we expect no change to result from this move. ••

The San Diego Union-Tribune had a dueling op-ed piece on Rent Control in its local editorial section, June 6, pages B-8 and B-9. One side was in favor of Rent Control Bill AB1482, the opinion expressed by Indivisible San Diego. The opposing side, against Rent Control, was penned by the California Apartment Association. No other comment necessary. ••

Excellent article by Gary Warth, San Diego Union-Tribune, Page B-1, June 11, "Program For Homeless Picks Up", about a Bob McElroy street and trash cleaning project administered by the Alpha Project. Homeless work 5 hours a day, 3 days a week, removing the trash left by other homeless people. That earns them \$60 per shift (Minimum Wage), minus the 30% required institutional housing payment of \$18, which equals \$42 per shift, or \$126 a week each. That is enough to buy a \$72 bus pass to go look for jobs, as well as enough money to buy lunch

on those days when far away from institutional lunch services, looking for work. It is also enough to pay for resume printing, buying a few articles of clothing, and paying for employee-provided equipment, such as hard hats. **This is an example of things that DO work on the homeless issue.** I envision in the future that a resident of North Park will be able to have a cleaning crew out at 7 AM, 7 days a week, to clean up their front yard, free. The name of this project is **Wheels For Change.** Keep up the good work. ••

Excellent article by **Andrea Lopez-Villafana, San Diego CityBeat**, June 12 issue, Page 6, "Storage Wars, Episode 3: Return of the Ultimatum". We have pointed out that the storage wars started in 1980 and got heated up in 2008, so this is more like Episode 6,304, but this article captures the essence of the complete lack of cooperation between City, County, citizens, businesses, nonprofits, funders, and the homeless, when it comes to providing storage for homeless possessions made necessary by a lawsuit against the City about 15 years ago. The article is a very accurate account of recent developments, even emphasizing the futility of homeless-handling efforts (and tax money!) all going nowhere. Quoting this article, "After numerous attempts to receive an update...little to no information was shared with CityBeat." We would try to help, but if they won't talk to CityBeat, what's the chances they'd talk to the San Diego Homeless News? **We're Radical Liberal and proud of it.** Our City doesn't even admit that it has 39,500 homeless and will reach 40,000 by the end of 2019. They also refuse to admit that nearly all money spent locally on the homeless problem is wasted. Wasted to create jobs and make money for the friends and families of politicians as "Unnecessary Professionals" such as Housing Navigators dealing with ZERO units of housing to navigate. San Diego's take on the homeless issue is mired in the 1930's and 1950's, with no valid changes unless ordered via ACLU lawsuits. And, even then, San Diego ignores Court Orders, too. Per Federal Court Order, San Diego must make **all** land it controls available to **all** of its homeless to sleep on, from 9 PM to 6 AM, 7 days a week, forever, or until it builds something like 15,000 housing units that rent for \$30 a week or less. The new closure of certain parks from 9 PM to 5 AM is an obvious violation of this Court Order, so the City is obviously in Contempt of Court. Call in the FBI? Imprison the Mayor and Council for Contempt? It all reads like something out of Donald Trump's Schizophrenic tweets: Less is more, more is less, and Progressives view the world upside-down and backwards because they fail to bow down and worship billionaires. Trump thinks he's a religion.

In Summary, nothing meaningful is being done on the homeless issue except to waste money, and electing new City Council members 8 months ago has had no impact. Now we need a Court Order that the City have at least one homeless storage facility in each Council District. And, because of how San Diego conducts its politics, the Court Order needs to specify how many storage units at each location, how large each storage unit will be, how close the storage unit location must be to bus stops, and exactly what hours it will be open. All else permits the City to scuttle everything via the details of the project, **which it always does.** San Diego makes sure that everything done on the homeless issue fails miserably, even doing research on those methods which have failed in other cities, adopting those methods here. Welcome to San Diego, America's Homeless City. Show your pride at being #1 at something! ••

Great article by **Gary Warth**, San Diego Union-Tribune, June 15, Page B-1, "Housing Commission Considers Tax on Unoccupied Homes". I suggested same half a dozen times in the past 12 years, plus this should apply to housing rentals. I suggested 90 days grace, followed by a \$10,000 per month tax each for those residential sale or rental units still vacant after 90 days. This would make every unit rent for its Fair Market Value, with no hoarding to drive up the price. As for the 340 new housing units being added annually, well, we have 340 more homeless every 4 months for 20 years straight, so that is giving a nickel to a starving man. In summary, a \$10 billion problem is being fed a few dollars at a time, while it gets worse. You want the math? We do that every few issues, but not every issue because it gets boring. ••

Attorney **Tom Theisen** appeared on both NBC-7 and KPBS News touting a new program called **YIGBY**, Yes In God's Back Yard, a program which would build housing on church parking lots. Theisen is the former chief of the RTFH, Regional Task Force on the Homeless. The main hurdle is that churches are required to have a certain number of parking spaces, even though they are usually used only one day a week, Sunday. I am always concerned that help from churches usually means accepting their biases and control. ••

Michael McConnell, the other former leader of RTFH, appeared on television in opposition of the proposed closing of yet another low-budget SRO motel downtown. ••

John Kitchin, our Editor, was asked by a group of philanthropists **what nonprofit organizations would be the best to donate to**, based upon getting the best results per dollar donated. He said that the Isaiah Project of Water Man David Ross is no longer around, so they don't count, but **ACLU**, the American Civil Liberties Union would be the top nonprofit in the struggle of San Diego's homeless to survive. Behind them, and also of great merit, **Think Dignity** (dot Org); **the Third Avenue Charitable Organization** (TACO) of the First Lutheran Church at 3rd and Ash, downtown; **Amikas** (dot Org); and **Project Hand Food Pantry**, St Mark's Lutheran Church, Chula Vista. Kitchin worked for both the Red Cross and American Cancer Society, and has been a homeless advocate in San Diego since 1989. ••

Michael Smolens, writing as a columnist in the San Diego Union-Tribune, pens "Only time will tell on efforts to help area's homeless", page B-1, June 28. He says 43% of homeless people living on the streets locally were "reported to" have mental health issues, and then says that is "almost half" of the 5,000 tallied in the annual count. **TIME OUT!** He is trying to sell two different highly-exaggerated Fake News issues, such as homelessness being caused by mental illness, Ronald Reagan's theory from the 1980's. Homelessness does cause mental illness, but at any given time only 10,000 of San Diego's 40,000 homeless are mentally ill. They get the most attention, however, in our severely-corrupt government and media.

Homelessness is caused by tearing down all of the \$30 a week housing, and replacing it with many fewer units of **\$450 a WEEK** housing. Very simple issue. The rest of the problem is the abuse of Human Spirituality, which religions call Gnosis, Tantra, Kosher, Halal, Cabals, Eucharist, and other words that you will not find a correct definition of in an unabridged dictionary. I censored out an explanation, as well as a criticism of Smolens, but I can easily see why he is now a Columnist instead of an Editor. ••

On the same page, **Gary Warth** writes "\$8 Million Allocated For Homeless", which is probably a misnomer, because it may be allocated to the **Repression** of homeless, and helping convince them to leave town or commit suicide, but it certainly does not go to any "**help**", per se. Where's our toilets? Where's our trash receptacles? We do NOT want to be blamed for there being PISS, SHIT, and trash all over the place. The new money will be used for two shifts of Outreach Harassment, which may very well double the number of homeless who commit Direct or Indirect suicide, from 300 per year to 600 per year. That's a big success, if you're Adolph Hitler Jr. The money will enrich some of the least-humane, greediest, and most-useless nonprofits in the area, leading to our government continuing to waste whatever money it earmarks for homelessness. **San Diego fights the homeless themselves, not homelessness**, making their struggle to survive an even more difficult and courageous process.

Get rich by starting the (fictional) "Most Useless" or "Most Worthless" nonprofit. Some assembly required. They serve lunch to 8 homeless, once a year, for 70 billion dollars. Spending money on the homeless issue has absolutely no bearing upon any positive outcomes nor accomplishments. Indeed, doubling the number of homeless suicides may cause increased funding of a plan. The money wasted "falls" into the pockets of politicians, their friends and families, and the perpetrators running the local real estate mafia. Lots of Unnecessary Professionals, such as Housing Navigators, helping find that ONE apartment that becomes available every five years. ••

"**Sexual harassment** by landlords coming to light through string of litigation", **Kristina Davis**, San Diego Union-Tribune, Sun., June 30, Page A-1. For at least 41 years that I know of, San Diego women have been forced to have sex with their landlords or be evicted. This is nothing new, but prosecuting it is. The lawsuit alleges violation of the Fair Housing Act in Spring Valley, an unincorporated suburb of San Diego. At one time, Spring Valley had more sex offenders than anywhere else in California. ••

On the same front page, **Kelly Davis and Jeff McDonald**, both top Journalists, write, "Records show treatment oversight lapses in SD county jails", about the entirely abysmal county mental health system. Davis has written for years about the mysterious and/or preventable deaths in the local system of jails. Davis also penned the article about Sharp Rocks being used to keep the homeless from taking shelter from the rain underneath a bridge. The County uses no-bid contracts to award certain providers (in this case with no prior experience) to provide treatment of inmates. I personally observed that our mental hospitals and behavioral (that means drug addiction) hospitals are run much the same. The article quotes **ACLU staff attorney Jonathan Markovitz** who lamented that the public may never know about most of the cases, nor is there likely to be any accountability. My take: Resolution of this issue is therefore up to the media, right? Can we get the

public to accept a hundred million dollars in damages per victim? San Diego County doesn't listen to anything but money. Way more material we wrote was edited out for length. Our editorials were successful at getting one mental health provider's license revoked. You're welcome. ••

"Housing heating up **Mayor's race**", **David Garrick**, San Diego Union-Tribune, Page B-1, July 1, quotes Todd Gloria as saying, "San Diego shouldn't settle for a Mayor who won't tackle the housing problem head on." Gloria was a key part when he was on the City Council of making our homeless problem happen. **Barbara Bry**, also running for Mayor, was not a part of that, but some of her recent comments, such as "They're coming for your house!" may put her even farther to the Right than Gloria. **The solution is for homeowners to move out of San Diego before this situation gets even more ugly. This will take at least 4 more years of government insanity, obviously.** Cory Briggs would make a fine Mayor, and so would Mike Aguirre. Bob Filner? What about Tom Theisen, Michael McConnell, or Jeeni Criscenzo? She's actually a politician by trade, and ran for Congress. None of these suggestions are serious, but illustrate the complete lack of being able to produce changes in San Diego using voting. ••

Gary Warth writes "Lot for homeless RVs nearly empty", July 5, San Diego Union-Tribune, Page B-1. A lot near the old Qualcomm-Jack Murphy- SDCCU-Hostess Twinkies? Stadium now exists for homeless living in RV's, but it lacks shade from the sun, and also lacks any sort of ocean breeze, so it is mostly too hot to use. Add to that, everyone must leave by 7 AM. And, it is difficult to sleep or live on such uneven pavement, a big hill. Typical of San Diego, homeless were not consulted in advance of any plans. This causes money spent to be wasted. Money is not the solution. Knowing the issue is paramount to solving any problem, and those folks in charge of spending homeless money know nothing whatsoever about the problem they are in charge of. To make things worse, those with a university education on the topic of homelessness are even stupider, because they tend to believe the FAKE studies done on it. MEETINGS:

Think Dignity's sub-group, the **Basic Dignity Coalition**, met the first Thursday of June, 6 PM, per usual, at the Moniker Warehouse, in the old Snowflake Baking Co. building near 16th and G, East Village San Diego. We were on the second floor. (East Village is nowadays considered part of downtown.) (Full Disclosure: John Kitchin, the Editor-Publisher of this newspaper, was one of the founders of this sub-group about eleven years ago.) • **Significant things were learned at this meeting, the most important of which is that the San Diego City Council apparently knows nothing whatsoever about the homeless problem, believing instead the city propaganda published in news accounts and press releases. No one knew that, because we figured they were too intelligent for that. We were wrong. See, all this is part of solving the homeless issue.** • Present were 18 persons, which is average, including 4 homeless, 4 attorneys, 2 news media, and the rest community leaders. • Volunteers are needed to help staff the **Fresh Start showers** program, contact attorney **Mitchelle Woodson** at mitchelle@thinkdignity.org. • The **East Village storage center** is currently maxed out at 400 units in use. People are being referred to the other storage center in Sherman Heights, but are generally refusing to go there. There are over 100 on the waiting list for East Village storage. • Attorney **Maresa Talbert** spoke about **BAPAC**, the Black American Political Association of California, an advocacy group dealing with our current **real estate Racial Red-Lining**, mistreatment of youth, economic Red-Lining, and

other race and cultural issues. Definitely a problem, as it appears to me, a local resident since 1978, that as many as half of San Diego's Blacks are in our jails and prisons at any given time, often convicted of something they didn't do. • **Heal San Diego** is operating in Ocean Beach, trying to help those who were living in vehicles and are now forced to hide. This is spreading out bad elements in all directions. The crackdown on parking has led to a rapid increase in meth and heroin use and sales, with people far more insecure, and many more spaced out on dope. **It was pointed out that those living in vehicles need temperature regulation, so they must park near the ocean to take advantage of cooler temperatures. Vehicles are extremely hot to live in.** In other areas, trees (such as in parks) are used for shade. • **Summer Survival Items** distribution will be on July 28 from 9 to 11:30 AM at 14th and L, downtown. This is a Sunday, and volunteers are sought. Visit www.ThinkDignity.Org. • **Tentatively, the next meeting will be held at the law offices of Robbins, Geller, Rudman, and Dowd (RGRD), Thursday, August 1, 6 PM, at 655 West Broadway, Suite 1900. This is on the 19th floor of an office high-rise. Wait in the lounge for the security guards to take you up on the elevator. This location is at Kettner Boulevard, across Broadway from the America Plaza trolley station. Access is via the Blue (not Orange) trolley line, or the many bus routes along Broadway. Access via the Green trolley line is by getting off at Santa Fe Amtrak Station, and then walking across the street to America Plaza, then across to the south side of Broadway. Note that this is NOT on 6th-7th and Broadway, because that is EAST Broadway, and this is WEST Broadway, about a mile west. Be sure to read any last-minute changes at www.ThinkDignity.Org.**

EDITORIAL DISCUSSION: Some of our investigators have determined that **the Mayor and City Council know nothing about Housing First**, the HUD-mandated program required of cities to receive federal housing money. We therefore need meetings with City Council members, or some way of educating them. • There is such a lack of transparency in San Diego that we need to speak with the City Council before they have meetings on issues, because by that time all decisions have already been made. • Many of our homeless are being told lies, such as being told they cannot vote.
