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Religious and Psychiatric Abuse

In 1982, I saw a Psychiatrist about tingling in my fingers, loss of feeling in my hands, and a difficulty both sleeping and waking up. He prescribed several medications, and although I minored in Psychotropic Pharmacy, none of these medicines existed when I went to graduate school. I just trusted my Psychiatrist. Bad mistake. 7 years later, having nearly no memory and in terrible shape mentally, I became diagnosed as a religion victim. In the meantime, all sorts of "professionals" wanted to tell me that I was Bipolar, or Monopolar Depressive, each one an entirely different diagnosis. I studied this stuff, and even taught Clinical Psychology for one semester at UWM, the University of Wisconsin - Milwaukee. The stuff the Psychiatrist had been giving me completely disconnected me from my education, and I was anesthetized, hypnotized, and spaced-out. I stopped taking any medicine, stopped eating abusive "Spiritual" food, and became just fine. Success. I would stay just fine until 2007, 8 years later, when I became homeless. I needed to eat food at Father Joe's and other help agencies. I became Bipolar, but that didn't make sense, because that is not a disease that comes and goes, it is very serious and for life. So what's wrong? This time I immediately recognized that I needed to stop eating the free food, and I also found a very good Psychiatrist, Dr. Harry Henderson iii, of La Mesa. He had over 40 years as a shrink, and together he had me helping to find out what was wrong. In the end, nothing wrong at all. My brain produces too little of 2 different chemicals, called Neurotransmitters. These are the substances that connect nerve networks together. The current prescription I am on has me more stable mentally than I have ever been in my life, and it is wonderful to function as well as I do. However, Dr. Henderson had to retire recently, due to poor health (he is something like 90 years old) and I have not been able to find a competent Psychiatrist. Everybody wants to tranquilize and control me, and nobody wants me to have complete function as a Professional.

Why Housing First? Why Not Transitional Housing, such as Solutions For Change?

Housing First, a mandatory component of all HUD programs that they fund, takes advantage of knowing that Transitional Housing programs both do not work, plus are very expensive. The opposite of Housing First, **Transitional Housing programs**, such as Solutions For Change, are mostly Faith-Based, have been around in the United States ever since the 1930's Great Depression, and were originally

administered by a Protestant church, the Salvation Army. The principles involved included keeping the homeless "Busy", working to clean streets, march in a band, sing in a choir, decorate the city with flowers and artwork, that sort of thing. Write poetry? Publish a newspaper? Certainly not a newspaper about Class Struggle! Another component was to provide food that had certain drugs (such as human DNA) added in order to hypnotize and control poor people. That's been going on for thousands of years, of course, but the levels of human blood and semen in the food provided for our "Outcast (OutCaste)" people is enough to make them mentally ill and/or commit suicide. They end up running around, hypnotized, screaming about Jesus and stuff. Obviously, this sort of behavior is neither beneficial for them nor for society, and, of course, psychiatric programs are expensive.

Housing First on the other hand, goes along well with prevention programs, such as Rapid Rehousing (RRH), Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG), and other **prevention programs**, such as Diversion. The key is to prevent the problem of being homeless from causing further damage to the individuals, especially damage that society will have to pay for long-term. It makes extremely good sense, saving money for the taxpayers. In short, Housing First is just Common Sense.

The opposite, Transitional Housing such as **Solutions For Change** is a **super-Conservative Religious Right plan** first used in the 1930's, and has emphasis on the control of people, rather than their well-being. It is well-intentioned, and has great elements to it, such as addressing families, employment, job training, and other sorts of desirable items, such as prevention of alcoholism and drug abuse. It combines hypnosis, abusive Spirituality, love, "Social Skills" that reinforce poor folks being slaves, and is primarily a religious tool. I was asked by the East County Transitional Living Center, ECTLC, to help them Secularize or de-religion their Baptist program, to help them get federal tax money under the Doctrine of Separation of Church and State. As an Atheist Bishop, that would indeed be my domain. **I refused, because it is impossible to take the slavery out of religion, and unethical to use drugged food and hypnosis to force obedience and tainted beliefs.** San Diego County seems to like hypnosis for a homeless solution, but it destroys the lives of those who are stupid enough to cooperate with the "Demons" (no such thing) who run these **Fundamental Christian programs. These programs go directly against all that Jesus of Nazareth stood for.** Eucharistic Abuse needs to be outlawed via the Criminal Justice System.

In a much better US Economy, Solutions For Change would be a viable plan, but although our Economy keeps getting **statistically** bigger and better, all of the money goes to the richest 1%, with **everyone else living in an Economic Depression**, including whatever is left of our once-affluent Middle Class of Professionals. The only thing that is moving our country along economically is the Social Security and SSI checks of the elderly and/or handicapped, plus the savings of whatever is left of the Middle Class. I predicted a Civil War and we seem to be getting one.

I am heavily censored on giving the **Beliefs of Jesus**, and have been trying to get a large article out on that for over a year, but I am being permitted by the Editor to say this: **Jesus of Nazareth** was a Jew that had **Buddhist** faith beliefs, which included that there is no God, gods, idols, spirits, ghosts, heaven, hell, satan, life hereafter, soul, etc. This caused a problem for the Roman Empire, because those knowing the truth about death are very difficult to turn into soldiers. All of these "Life Hereafter", "Heaven and Hell" things are **basic Roman Paganism**, and Jesus was opposed to that, so he was sentenced to die. The Jews not being Pagan already knew most of this. What caused problems between Jesus and the Jews was that **Buddhism insists that all persons be taught about Human Spirituality**, or how to have a good life by placing your blood and/or semen in the foods of others, thus receiving their "love" and being able to control them, which are the secrets of the Kaballah (Jewish Book of Secrets) and the key to how foods really become "kosher". **All of the writings of the followers of Jesus were destroyed by both the Romans and the Jews, but one copy survived, the Nag Hammadi Library. [Note that all on-line editions may be fake or intentionally mistranslated. Also note that these writings began one thousand years before the birth of Jesus, and their philosophies were changed by him (some of them) during his lifetime.]** Once Jesus died, the Roman Pagans wrote the bible to give the Pagan "truths" about heaven, hell, etc., and changed the name of Jesus, naming him after the Day of the Emperor, Christmas. The word "Christ" means "Duly anointed Emperor of the Greek (or Roman) Empire". So, the Roman Pagans invented the comic-book super-hero, Jesus "Christ".

Towards Reality

Years back, I got the idea that some of the help organizations were very humane, aware, very in touch with reality, versus other organizations that either didn't know or didn't care. I even attempted to rate these organizations, based not upon Public Image, but rather their statements of value and purpose, what is said by their clients, that sort of thing. I wanted to insert some feedback into the whole "help" situation. A lot of that very old information is still posted on-line today, as an archive but not as any current valid information. Archives are important or we can never learn from our past mistakes. What happened over the past five years is that the more-humane groups got their funding reduced or lost, and were replaced with the less-humane groups. Also, all groups have gotten less humane. All this has had a devastating effect not only on the poor clients, but also on the employees of the nonprofits, which experienced huge turnover. People get burned out when their help doesn't help. Volunteers quit when they find out that a lot of the help provided doesn't help anybody, just shuts them up. Are we saving money, or losing our effectiveness, or maybe both?

It would be possible to quantify all of this along the terms of how long clients must wait in line for a meal, what freedoms are afforded them as far as what times they can enter and exit a shelter, that sort of thing. **I suggested all along that the input of the homeless must be a part of how society does business,**

both with regard to planning and also regarding client satisfaction with the services provided. Is that shocking to you? Then you need to work in a different business. Or, you need to learn some of the basics all over again, even though, as mammals, un-learning something is 3 times as hard as learning it right the first time. That's why you can't teach an old dog new tricks. An essential part of a successful integrated system to do anything at all requires feedback from those affected, and this is no different with the homeless. Feedback must continuously be solicited from those affected by the homeless situation, including business investors, retail shops, landlords, transportation officials and their clients, and, of course, the homeless themselves. **There also needs to be a huge amount more known about the homeless situation than currently exists in all of these pretty and scholarly works.** Homelessness is one area of study where the differences between the book-knowledge and the reality are extreme. So it means that society does not really know (or admit) what homelessness is all about.

In the Focus Strategies Phase One Plan, for example, there is no analysis of Public Transportation, (including walking or bicycles) that has mention, despite that being a major component of our homeless situation regarding location. Homeless accumulate downtown because of the following: Father Joe's Lunch, a Social Security Office, lots of bus and trolley transportation, medical and psychiatric care, banks and pharmacies, a lot of people who may wish to contribute money, grocery stores, second-hand stores, multiple different types of churches, bridges that protect from sun or rain, local government offices, temporary jobs, 24-hour motion (noise), Balboa Park, nearby slums, help venues, a law library, and a very good regular library. Did I leave anything out? You know it takes a homeless person to write this. **Not having toilets nor showers is a drawback, but only minor.** Adding them would benefit the businesses and homeowners downtown with less stink and nasty pheromones, but neither toilets nor showers will draw folks downtown nor out of downtown, those other things listed are the draw. So, would you buy a condo in Hepatitisville? Do they have a vaccine for Cholera, or Dysentery, next month's epidemic? Am I making my point? We can become Disease-of-the-Month Club!

There is a news item leaked by Kris Michell, of Civic San Diego (and related agencies) that the **new Homeless Check-In Center is planned for 20th and B, in South Park.** Unacceptable, because only one bus route, Route 2, can be used, for example. Like the heckler said at the Homeless Committee meeting (last issue), "Why not Houston"? **If they build it, will they come? No, if they build it they will waste taxpayer money,** but there will be lots of re-election campaign money from those whose pockets got filled. How about a Homeless Intake Center in Middletown, perhaps 4th and Ivy? Okay, **the stuff downtown that cannot be moved is Father Joe's, Balboa Park, the Downtown Library, and the huge bus and trolley system. Marco Li Mandri's group suggested using Golden Hall,** and that is close to all four of those things. So, what do we do with the events planned for Golden Hall? Well, hold them next door at the Performing Arts Center, or at the San Diego Convention Center, Petco Park, the Downtown Library, or Qualcomm Stadium. You don't want homeless at any of those venues, but having homeless at Golden Hall just brings back the era of Mayor Susan Golding, remember? Both Golden Hall and the outside area (City Hall) do have toilets already, so how about having Think Dignity, Third Avenue Charitable Organization, or Amikas operate the new shelter and homeless check-in? That would make too much sense for a government to do?

Sarcastic Comedy: Move all the homeless to Lori Zapf's district, since she obviously knows nothing about the homeless situation. We can register them to vote, but we would have to save up enough money for a Manual Recount and Exit Polls, unless Summer Stephan has arrested the Registrar of Voters. They don't even pay me to do this "Homeless Planning Commission" stuff. We gotta stop the audit of [REDACTED], too, or there will be another huge scandal when drug-money-laundering gets exposed, and San Diego has enough scandals already. Do you think the Governor can give them a Pardon, in advance? And, of course, future drug money should be laundered thru the British Royal Family's HSBC Banks, or their BP (ARCO) Petroleum. If somebody finds out, they'll send James Bond to process them into cans of dog food, just like Jimmy Hoffa. Does the downtown tavern [REDACTED] still sell cocaine? It would all make a fine Mel Brooks movie, "Blazing [Crack-Pipes Hidden Under] Saddles". At least they kicked the hookers out of the Mayor's office. If Mayor Filner had them, he'd still be Mayor.

That's the view from the sidewalk, a little blurry because a big dog just pissed in my face. Who trains their dog to pee on homeless people, anyway? A new pet-training course for downtown residents sponsored by the Housing Commission? What ever happened to Sharp Rocks? At the NAEH meeting I attended, somebody asked, "What do we do if the Rapid Rehousing landlord is a slum-lord?" The joking

response was, "Run him for City Council, and maybe he can someday run for Mayor!" True story.

Solutions:

Overnight parking, different rules, permitting sleeping in cars with a lot of restrictions. Those receiving Privileges in Spirituality should contribute to all normal foods for all people, not overloading the homeless. All those to be given Psychiatry should have their brain Neurotransmitters balanced, first. Tiny Homes and other pilot programs must move forward. Maybe we can work with the San Diego Mafia, since they have an interest in the homeless situation, too. Since the Retirement and Pension Plans of the Politicians and City Workers are all tied up in the value of real estate, we should work on plans that both increase the value of that real estate, plus rapidly diminish our number of homeless. I propose a Granny Flats (Companion Units) nonprofit, that uses volunteers and is aligned with Habitat For Humanity, to begin a thousand new units, everywhere. Feedback

Pat McArron sent a letter of thanks for my work, and included a photo of a man defecating outside of the Downtown Library. •

Jessica Carr, who works for the **Salvation Army** and represents the San Diego homeless on the Board of the **RTFH** (see meeting, this edition) spoke with me before the meeting, and offered to take me out for coffee and discuss homeless issues. She agreed that she was not perhaps the most ideal person to be representing us, because her homelessness was long ago, when she was a little girl, plus the homeless she deals with at the Salvation Army are mostly families, not individuals. I told her it was her Salvation Army job that made her a Conflict of Interests and thus inappropriate to represent the San Diego homeless, because of their side-role ever since the 1930's of keeping us drugged with the food provided. She asked if I would be interested in replacing her on the Board when her term expires next summer, and I replied that no one person can represent the San Diego Homeless, because we are such a diverse group of people and families. **I told her that I would have less impact on the Board than I have now. I was well aware that I was one of the most politically-powerful persons at this meeting,** but I never abuse things like that, either. I have so little money, that I cannot even afford to send a letter, nor eat lunch at a far-away place, nor wear proper clothing and shoes, nor buy transportation to many meetings and events. She understood, entirely. I think I do a very adequate job (for one person) representing San Diego's homeless, and I will continue to do my best at that.

Facebook had several page Administrators reject the **San Diego Homeless News** link as "Spam", but that was reviewed by the Facebook Editor, me. It does not cost money on-line, does not sell subscriptions, does not accept paid advertising, does not get sent along with advertising, so none of it is monetary. As far as being Political Spam, it gives many perspectives regarding how to help solve the San Diego homeless problem, and does print opposing views. Not Spam.

The **Internet Search Engines** and me: The new Search Engine formula for the web is to promote websites that are critical of sites like mine. There are two particular clicks on Google that say negative things about me. One is **Reddit's discussion on "Bad Philosophy"** that criticizes some of my past Philosophy course teachings from many years back. Well, I wrote about many different teachings, and this was a college course in Philosophy. In college, there are many perspectives, and NONE of these is mine. •

The other article critical of **me has me confused with all 330 people who are named "John Kitchin", as if I am all of them.** Sir John Kitchin was the Mayor of Bristol, England, and another Sir John Kitchin worked for the British Secret Service. There are also at least a dozen **John Kitchin, Esq.** out there, attorneys with my name, and some of them are Facebook friends of mine. I do not use "Sir" nor "Esq." but I do use "Dr.", although I did not use that until 3 years into my being homeless. There are over dozen **Dr. John Kitchin** people out there, and 3 from San Diego! The most popular Dr. John Kitchin is CMU, the famous Chemical Engineer at Carnegie Mellon University. I use NZ9F after my name, my personal FCC call letters as an Amateur Extra, the Ph.D. of communications radio. As for **Rev. John Kitchin**, there are 8 that I could find, but technically I am "Most Rev." because my philosophical writings got me elected a Bishop. I taught Theology and Seminary and still do. The Bishop designation is why I cannot be prosecuted for writing or speaking about Human Spirituality under British Common Law, which is still in effect in the US, long after July 4, 1776. Our hospitals are operated under British Maritime and Overseas

Common Law, and both Citizens Arrest and Common Law Marriage are binding laws in the US, to this day.

Getting back to the name **Kitchin**, the common name is Kitchen, but my last name traces to the British Royal Family, which is why there are so many rich or famous (or infamous) folks named John Kitchin. One day in Northern Wisconsin (Nicolet National Forest) a UFO landed and wanted to speak with me about Chemical Engineering. I told them they had the wrong John Kitchin. I gave them some berries, honey, and powdered milk to take back into space. Add some cereal and water, and you've got breakfast. Ham operators are de-facto ambassadors, talking to folks all over the world, but I seem to also be an ambassador for SOL4, our planet. SOL3 is the moon, and both our numbers and the English Alphabet are used on many planets.

Evaluating the Focus Strategies Regional Plan

I am impressed with the quality of their work, and how thorough they are, and how well-researched. There are a few Red Flags, and a few things they did not consider, but they did a splendid job. They use a lot of material such as quotes from me that have appeared on my website or in the San Diego Homeless News, but that could have come from others, too, saying the same thing. There is, then, some perspective of the homeless in this. There were also other things that I suggested, and those became used, too. More recently than that, **some of the current policies and procedures being used are ones that come out of my material,** such as combining HOT and PERT in many applications, and using campgrounds to house the homeless in the far South County. I also forced the updating of "211" to a highly usable information service, which it is today. (My contributions are not the issue; just having them proves some input from the homeless.) Here is my analysis, piece by piece, with page numbers:

1 On any given night an estimated 9,000 people in the San Diego Region are living outdoors, in vehicles, or emergency shelters...homelessness remains a persistent and growing problem.

The total homeless is more like 45,000 or 90,000, really, when you also add in the East County rural homeless, the sex-housing in La Jolla and the beaches, the well-hidden homeless, couch surfers, 3-day-a-week hotel dwellers, etc. They do not grasp the concept of our "Homeless Rotation". Of our 90,000 homeless, only 10% are on the sidewalk on any given night, but the full 90 thousand suffer.

All the community leadership must be engaged and aligned around a common set of objectives...the ultimate goal is that people secure housing, not shelter.

Is it possible to get this community to agree about anything, even the color of street signs? Do we have enough housing for this to be successful?

2 Maximizing the inventory available in the existing rental market will be essential...Success year-over-year will be measured by changes in the size of the homeless population...

No accurate measure of the number of homeless has ever existed for San Diego. Shall we build one? I suggested that but was ignored. The PITC is politics, not an accurate count.

4 ...strong programs, financial investment, and committed providers are not sufficient to create measurable and visible reductions in homelessness...all resources must be aligned around a consistent set of strategies...

Okay, but do the Clients count? This report somewhat ignores the homeless themselves. Our cooperation is the most important element in the Regional Plan!

Everyone is understood to be "Housing Ready".

Yes, that is a basic principle behind "Housing First", but it is really San Diego, and not the homeless, that is not "Housing Ready".

5 ...it is critical to emphasize that the results...do not include meeting broader anti-poverty objectives...it is not feasible to build a new housing unit for every homeless person.

So all this is just carefully-contrived bullshit? It has to be a lot more than that!

6 The Homeless Crisis Response System recognizes that having housing is better than living outside or in a car...
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Very poor assumption if you have ever seen the awful options in San Diego. You folks obviously have no personal experience at this.

This system...will be focused on meeting people's needs for housing, not on meeting provider needs to fill their programs.

This would be a major change from our present "Cash Cow" system, but will our corrupt leaders (and many nonprofits) listen?

Decisions about what approaches to invest in will be informed by data, not by assumptions about what works.

This is an even bigger change from our present system, and a welcome one, but you are interfering with established corruption. (Papa Gambino's gonna make you a dishwasher.)

Resources will be dedicated to programs...reducing homelessness...not just...providing services to homeless people.

Dream On, but I like it. Possible, improbable, and goes against 50 years of the wealthy using homeless issues to give their relatives employment.

7 Maximizing the inventory...in the...rental market will be essential...

San Diego has a system which only approves million-dollar condos and rejects all other housing proposals. That is a major component of why we are America's Homeless City.

8 To truly create a regional system, all...must be engaged...around a common set of objectives.

Very slim chance of that, because our communities operate as independent City-States, and do not even obey State nor Federal laws.

11 ...the critical role that outreach can play in engaging chronically homeless people and setting them on a pathway to housing. • ...families will be assisted to remain in their current housing...

This is a huge plus because dysfunctional families are a problem forever for their children.

13 Helping people stay in safe, informal shared housing situations or in rent-burdened situations has to be viewed as a positive outcome in relation (to) the alternative of homelessness.

Often not the case, so you lack personal experience. The advantage of being homeless is that you no longer need to spend every minute trying to come up with rent money.

Each of these intervention types...must serve as a rapid pathway to housing. If not, people will continue to cycle from the street to shelter and back, resulting in an ever-increasing number that experience chronic homelessness...the main focus is on helping residents secure housing.

Rare words of truth. The Revolving Door, or Homeless Rotation, is the most expensive and costly fixture of our present system, both for the homeless, and for the entire community. It creates a cash Conflict of Interests in that many programs lose money on housing, but cash in on other services such as medical, dental, and psychiatric care. San Diego help is Greed-based. CoC means lots of jobs for the friends and families of rich people, supplying these needs.

14 The City of San Diego...(is beginning the) development of a facility (to)...access core services and begin the process...

Okay. Needs a bus or trolley stop within 100 feet (lots of handicapped folks using crutches) that has a bus or trolley every 15 minutes on weekdays. Must be located in the "Homeless Homeland", which is the geographic area that the homeless never move out of. Lunch provided 7 days a week. Nearby large park and library. Nearby grocery stores, convenience stores, and dollar stores. Nearby toilets and showers. At least twelve different locations. Outlying locations in the outlying homelands. Sounds very expensive, and else this does not work.

15 Transitional Housing...(is) ineffective in relation to its high costs and long lengths of stay.

We definitely agree that TH needs to be banned. People who are homeless need to use drugs and alcohol just to stay sane, and TH interferes with this, but Housing First does not necessarily. None of this takes into account the Rate of Housing Destruction by the City's "Homeless

Creation Agency", called Civic San Diego - Downtown Partnership - Clean and Safe. These folks drained the swamp and now they are up to their ears in homeless (human) alligators.

23 ...seeing reductions in the number of people experiencing homelessness will require investing in system changes that will actually solve the problem...Leadership...will need to learn a new...set of skills.

Yes, that is what it is all about. Still to go, page 42-55, in the Appendix Section. Another day, because this is too boring.

District Attorney Race:

So far, we back Corey Briggs, Elizabeth Crowley, Mike Aguirre, Robert Scott Dreher, or how about Rachel Jensen? How about Michael Crowley? None of these folks are even running at this time. The DA Election follows the OLD rules, where the polls in June usually decide the winner. See the two articles on Summer Stephan at the end of News Media News, this edition.

Electoral Fraud - National

On Facebook's **Election Scam Clearinghouse**, a voting machine manufacturer admitted that the **personal information** of 1.8 million voters in the Chicago area was made public. <https://finance.yahoo.com/news/voting-machine-supplier-exposes-1-210100800.html> • A different company, hired by the US Republican Party, **leaked personal information on 198 million US citizens.** <https://www.engadget.com/2017/06/19/gop-company-leaked-198-million-citizens/?fref=gc> • The Democrats won their dropping of the lawsuit regarding the 2016 Primary Election being fixed. Although it was found that **they did cheat, and that Bernie Sanders should have been their Nominee, it was also ruled that a Political Party can legally cheat** on a Primary Election, under British Common Law.

Electoral Fraud - State

Note that VBM is "Vote By Mail". Meetings:

The Regional Task Force on the Homeless Governing Board

met **August 17, 2017**, at the County Administration Building, 1600 Pacific Highway, 3 PM, with a whopping **87 present**, which included 31 on the Board and 56 spectators and public. **CEO Gordon Walker** announced that the one Action Item today, to approve the work of Focus Strategies, would have to instead be approved at the next meeting, next month, because there was **not enough advanced notice given to vote on it** at this meeting, under the State of California Brown Act. The Brown Act makes it a Criminal Offense to fail to provide advanced notice to the public before a meeting like this takes a vote on it. • Chairman and County Supervisor **Ron Roberts** next held **Non-Agenda Public Comment**, and 4 people submitted slips to speak, getting a maximum of 3 minutes each. Non-Agenda Public Comment is also required by the Brown Act. • First speaker was myself, **John Kitchin**, and all I had was an Announcement that MAPSS, the Metropolitan Association of Providers of Social Services, would be having a **FREE class in how to use the new CES**, Coordinated Entry System computer program, becoming mandatory for everyone to use under HUD regulations. Each area is required to come up with a single computer program, to be used by all help agencies in that area, so that everyone is on the same computer page, literally. • Second speaker, **Greg Knowell** of the **Legal Aid Society** of San Diego, who said that they now have a pilot program to provide free legal help for those tenants facing eviction. If you are being evicted, you probably cannot afford a lawyer, plus you need one very quickly, so use the County's prevention resource for a free lawyer. • **Alexia Andratti** complained that the homeless greatly increased downtown in the past 3 years "under your watch". She wants answers as to why there are **no toilets downtown**, and also wants action. • **Dennis Stern** said that he is making a **camera documentary** of this group, because most people have no idea what goes on inside. • Next, **Chair Ron Roberts** said that **State Senate Bills 2 and 3** would provide more money for housing the poor. He said that he has been checking out the cold-weather shelters in Portland, Oregon. • **Vice-Chair Chris Ward**, of the San Diego City Council, said that action was taken regarding streamlining permitting and processing new housing, and that Companion Units (Granny Flats) were now easier to have. He also said there will be 620 new Affordable Housing units in San Diego, 203 of which are in Mission Valley. He said that the **Homeless Committee** of the City Council would be meeting **Sept. 13 at 9 AM**, to discuss legislation, the use of **Golden Hall and the Qualcomm Practice Field** for housing that is temporary, and the establishment of **Safe Parking Zones** for people to live in their cars. He said that **Jonathan Herrera**, the Mayor's Senior Planner, travelled to Seattle and also Portland, to look at Bridge Housing. Ward also said that **City Attorney Mara Elliott** promised more proactive efforts to prevent homelessness. • **Secretary Karen Brailean** said that the **Appeals Committee** would be meeting Sept. 8, and called for volunteers to be on that committee. • **Gordon Walker** said there were letters and emails sent out requesting data and that all agencies need to supply the data requested. • Next, the **Ad Hoc Committee** dealing with the **Focus Strategies planning documents** started to reveal the new Community Plan. They conducted **45 Key Stakeholder interviews**, but none of them was a past or present homeless person, nor any form of spokesperson for the homeless. I made the comment that there was **little or no input from the homeless anywhere in the report**. I likened it to this Board being the Bureau of Indian Affairs, and not speaking with any Native Americans at all before establishing the rules by which that group must live by. My point was taken. • **Jessica Carr** of the **Salvation Army** said that not all agencies are "in the **Housing First** sandbox", because their organizations have certain rules like enforcing sobriety as a condition of participation in programs. She said that there needs to be room for all agencies at the funding table. **Gordon Walker** responded that we are mostly Housing First, because that and HMIS are required under Federal Funding regulations. He said that we need the data from all groups, in order to operate as a complete system. (Side note that one of the data problems is that certain groups do not share their data, and so skew the information that this group needs.) This brought the comment that much **funding for youth programs** is not Federal funds. There was also mentioned **Performance-Based Contracting**, and of course that has in the past meant agencies cheating on data in order to receive more money. **A lot of that which has happened in the past is not in this plan nor a part of it.** • Next a report from the Police on the first **County-Wide Law Enforcement meeting** on the homeless protocol. The police need to tap into resources at 3 AM, even though they are not a homeless service provider. They need access to all programs, information, available beds, etc., to de-criminalize homelessness. • Information Items included an update on the **Hepatitis A** epidemic. The current outbreak of Hep A is the **second-largest US outbreak in history**, since the vaccine was introduced in 1995. The virus can live as long as two months on surfaces, and can cause liver disease for as long as six months. The specific San Diego strain has been linked to Utah, Arizona, Colorado, and other places in California ONLY. **The HMIS Data was used to track this virus.** 15,800 vaccinations were given, including sending teams of nurses out to homeless

encampments. No food sources were identified as the cause. Those who come in contact with the homeless should be vaccinated. • Next **Casey Nguyen** of **Interfaith Community Services** spoke about the recent **NAEH (National Association to End Homelessness) convention** held in Washington, DC. She said this is networking with other communities, with the objectives of increasing HUD funding, funding for Medicaid, funding for Affordable Housing, and funding for USICH, the United States Interagency Council on the Homeless. She said there were many organizations represented, and good representation of San Diego. **Housing Secretary Ben Carson** spoke solidly in favor of **Housing First**. The group reflected on Best Practices involving landlord engagement, CES and HMIS data, cooperation, special veterans interests, a Regional Crisis System, and each community having an RTFH-CoC. Many communities are struggling. There are ballot initiatives proposed by the San Diego Housing Federation, as well as legislation being currently considered by the State, which would help the homeless situation. Affordable Housing alone will not solve our problem. Chronic homelessness is up 60%. The meeting concluded 20 minutes early, to permit networking. ♦♦♦♦♦

My Editorial on the meeting: First off, **Landlord Engagement** has not worked well at all, so far, and I explain why in previous editions. Secondly, a **"Move On"** strategy for PSH (Permanent Supportive Housing) residents increases Recidivism, and while PSH is the most expensive intervention, Recidivism, cycling back and forth from housing to the sidewalk, is even more expensive. Third, the statement **"Don't make shelters so comfortable...that people want to return often (or never leave)..."** is **absolutely insane**, and shows that some people have never been in a shelter before. That is why I am doing this evaluation, to place a homeless perspective on this.

2 1/2 years ago, when the NAEH Winter National Convention was held in San Diego at the Sheraton Harbor Island (Feb. 2015), I was the ONLY homeless person there in the entire nation, and my message for that national association was that they need to adopt a policy of Housing First.
