EMERGENCY:

50% MTS Fare Increase

MTS plans a nearly 50% fare increase for Seniors and Disabled, and plans to ram this through by the end of the month. We need picketing, t-shirts, attending their meetings to protest, and lots of signs. Our Seniors cannot even afford to eat, with the 300% increase in low-end (inexpensive) foods the past 18 years.

Why now? People, especially activists, are busy with the elections, but isn't it after the elections that there will be a clearer picture of the political environment? I cannot afford the \$18 pass now, but sacrifice by going without food two days a month to pay it. With the fare increase, I would be up to 3 days a month without food. Yes, I get all subsidies and food giveaways that I qualify for, already. (Food Stamp money is paid in cash in California because you need it for rent and stuff.) Is any of this part of the Donald Trump Senior Starvation Program? 300% Inflation (on low-end foods and supplies) in 18 years, but Seniors only got Cost of Living Adjustments of about 20% total in all that time! Remember 65-cent knockoff Spam? It is now over two dollars, typical of low-end-only price increases. 65-cent 8-packs of donuts are now \$2.79.

My take is that MTS transit should be free to users, paid for by a tax on cars, parking, or a freeway toll. The toll option would have just a few toll gates on present freeways, and most folks would pay electronically, using bypass lanes, like the Otay Tollway. This would eliminate major costs to MTS such as collecting fares, all sorts of fare boxes and ticket machines, keeping electronic track of passes, and utilizing compliance officers to make sure riders pay. Anyone could exit the freeway and drive around the toll gates avoiding the tolls, too, making them voluntary. They get you there quicker. Or, you could take MTS, and pay no gasoline, no fare, and no tolls.

RTFH Meetings – Regional Task Force on the Homeless

I was asked why I don't usually cover the Governing Board meetings of the RTFH, Regional Task Force on the Homeless. The reasons are many. I am not welcome there, and that has been made obvious many times. I question the value of what they have done plus what they are doing. Every time I speak there, spectators come up to me after the meeting and say things like, "How come you're the only one here who makes any sense?" I am sick and tired of trying to answer that question. I was tentatively offered a position on the Board, representing the San Diego homeless, but it meant that I would have to shut up, and would have increased their credibility as a viable solution to our homeless problems, which they are definitely not.

Once called the Mayor's Task Force on the Homeless, the RTFH has as its main task the attracting of federal HUD money to San Diego, and also determining how it is spent. They are also tasked with conducting the annual (fake) Point-In-Time Count (PITC) every January, where San Diego's 35,000 homeless (20,000 provable) end up being only 9,000 or so, and going down in number by 8% the past year. The news media actually help misinform the public on the homeless numbers issue!

A major player in the RTFH is the San Diego Housing Commission, which gets a large share of the \$72 million in HUD funds, down from \$82 million two years ago when San Diego Mayor Kevin Faulconer helped reorganize it. RTFH makes sure that all the money that comes in is spent on inefficient things that do not reduce homelessness and bankroll abusive charities that further a 1950's view of society, family, ethics, and rehabilitation. Sorry, but above all, Journalism is a quest for truth. Every Editor knows all this for years now, but sharing it risks their job.

Instead of housing that is real housing, such as apartments, the "housing" the RTFH backs is things like roommate-shared hotel rooms in a hotel that requires checking in at the main desk, or beds in an institution or maybe a rubber tent. They also give out thousands and thousands of housing vouchers that, basically, no landlord will accept. In addition, they make lots of work for the children, nephews, nieces, etc., of the Ruling Class, insisting upon using the HUD money for Psychiatrists, Physicians, Psychologists, Case Workers, Housing Navigators, Data Specialists, and similar, not housing. Both the housing and the services are not appreciated as having a value by most homeless, the former because it is not really housing, and the latter because most of the services provided are neither necessary nor useful. Both are a scam to control people as opposed to helping them.

The RTFH refuses to admit that all of our homelessness was caused by Redevelopment and no other factor, and has now accepted the task of helping cover all that up. So, above all, the RTFH is a Propaganda machine. [This article was written before Gordon Walker left the RTFH.] People speculated that bringing in CEO Gordon Walker might be a precursor to cooking the books on the homeless situation, because Utah officially showed the most progress statistically at homeless abatement, eventually proving to be statistical fraud and misleading data involving trick definitions, counting, and re-classifications, much like the cooked data that has been circulated by Father Joe's Villages with the help of the news media.

To close the rubber circus tents two years ago, Mayor Faulconer said that there would instead be indoor housing at Father Joe's, and that each and every resident of the tents would get a place there. Sounds nice, right? Father Joe's Villages, which was completely FULL at that time, threw everybody out to make room for the residents of the rubber tents. Net change in homeless? Zero. Every single detail of every single thing done on the homeless issue in San Diego has been a complete scam for over 30 years.

So, getting back to why I have not been covering the RTFH meetings, it is because you already get enough bullshit from the conventional news media now. No need to increase that. In San Diego, if you speak or write the truth, people are encouraged to consider you mentally ill. Once upon a time all LGBT people were considered mentally ill, and I am not LGBT but I support their valid perspectives. Before that, anyone who said that women should be able to go to Law School or Medical School was considered a crackpot. Same treatment for those who advocated for Blacks, too. I was the little White boy, Editor of my gradeschool newspaper, marching with Martin Luther King. The San Francisco Chronicle effectively eliminated the worst parts of homelessness there. We Media can do the same here.

Solutions? Granny Flats, Tiny Homes, there are a few that show promise and have worked in many other cities. Never pump out an editorial unless you have some ideas how to make things better. My solutions paper was called "5.1 Regional Plan", but I now know a hundred times as much as I did when I wrote that. By the way, many parts of my 5.1 Regional Plan are currently in use locally. What I added to the issue that was never done before is the perspective of an actual homeless person. I also added the perspective of a retired Police Chief, myself, but I'm only a Ph.D. and that is only halfway to becoming intelligent. I have a new Granny Flats plan, very recent, and the old Tiny Homes plan is finally being tried in San Diego, originally invented by Floyd Morrow and now by Jeeni Criscenzo and Robert Bird of Amikas.Org. (See "Other News", below.)

Conclusions: Real solutions will never be allowed on the homeless issue because a large number of Special Interests, most of them nonprofits, make billions on the system not working. Fix it, and they go broke. If you make ten million dollars a year on a problem, would you shoot yourself in the foot and solve that problem? That is why we have scams

instead of solutions, and why the heading of this newspaper reads "Helping to Correct the Lies Which Perpetuate Homelessness". Bottom Line: Investing just half of what HUD gives the San Diego area in one year could be used, one time only, to make the homeless problem go away, permanently. It won't happen, because all of the current service providers would oppose it, dragging in the news media for help. Think about that the next time a homeless person takes a shit in your flowerbed. Oh, the City solution is to pass out nose-plugs?

San Diego: City of Death

More homeless die from suicides each year than find housing

I was sent a nice article from the Times of San Diego about San Diego being the City of Life. I read it and agreed with most of it. It is also true, however, that San Diego must be considered the City of Death, too. Not just murders committed by police and covered up by the District Attorney, but also City behavior that causes suicides, death by disease, and other fatal factors.

The Hepatitis A outbreak was caused by a cook becoming infected from swimming in the ocean, getting infected by San Diego sewage. The City-County Cabal (Gnostic Group) was fearful of tourism losses, and so intentionally spread the virus to the homeless, in order to confuse the issue, making it a homeless thing and not a tourism and beach sewage one. People died. I suffered liver damage and can no longer drink craft beer. My sources are multiple, and cannot be revealed without causing those involved immense harm, probably more than merely the loss of their job and home.

San Diego has exemptions from having to process its sewage, and so dumps it raw, adding only iron chloride to reduce how soluble it is. Since sewage goes southbound via the Longshore Current (the centrifugal force from the spin of the Earth), ending up at the Equator, most of our sewage problems are from San Diego, not Tijuana.

Enough talk about poop? What about City toilets? 32 were removed from Downtown San Diego in this century, and most of that was written about when it happened, in this newspaper and before that in Yahoo News — Associated Content. The biggest problem isn't that of smell nor diseases from the lack of toilets, but rather the problem of suicides. Having no downtown showers is also a major cause of suicides.

The biggest cause of suicides, however, is not having housing for many people, over 19 thousand of us, and not having jobs that pay enough money to pay to rent housing. That is the big killer. And, of course, only something like 1 out of 30 homeless suicides actually gets recorded that way in the record books. It helps to have a compliant ("cooperative") District Attorney, of course.

A few years back there was news that the number of people who died on the sidewalk was up to over 100 people per year. Of course, there was actually 3 or 4 times that many, but most who died were not identified as homeless. A huge percentage of San Diego homeless have never been identified as such, so when they die are not grouped into the statistic of "homeless who died this year".

A thousand low-cost housing units are torn down for Redevelopment each year, for the last 20 years running, causing a thousand more homeless each year. 150 new institutional "Hitler-camp" housing units are created, plus 150 new "fake hotel" units, too, but what about the other 700 who became homeless? About 350 hit the sidewalk each year and another 350 die from suicide.

Homeless suicides are recorded as accidents or diseases, not suicides in the official records, but they are caused by the lack of wanting to stay alive. Every year as many as 400 San Diego homeless give up, no longer give a shit about staying alive, and so they don't seek shelter from the rain, nor do they go to the doctor when sick, nor do they get out of the way of a fast-moving truck. They get the relief of death. That is where homelessness ends, suicide via the loss of the will to live. It only ends in finding housing for a rare few, and the "housing" found is usually not real housing and worse than the sidewalk. And, the housing found is only temporary, while suicide is permanent.

Every year hundreds of the San Diego homeless find fake housing in institutions, but only 50 or less (and probably fewer than 20) find real housing and are no longer homeless, while as many as 400 take their own lives, either via Direct Suicide or Indirect Suicide (personal negligence assuring one's own death, intentionally, via an accident or disease). So, for many among the homeless and poor, **San Diego is indeed the City of Death**. Why?

Lack of showers and toilets, difficulties finding food, intentionally-tainted food, lack of water, lack of housing, lack of jobs, housing prices higher than jobs pay, harassment via outreach and police, jails, destruction of personal possessions, living outdoors in the cold rain, it all adds up. It adds up to the relief of death in the City of Death, San Diego.

"Die quietly, White Nigger. It makes all your problems go away, and our problems too, namely you."

I charge the City and County with blatant disregard for human life. The real criminals are not those arrested for being on the sidewalk, but rather those who put them there to make a billion dollars a week on downtown condo sales alone. Lock up a politician for crimes committed against their constituents, like Manslaughter. Some of this has intent to it, so what is intentional Manslaughter? First-Degree Murder.

But, the more soap the dirtier the political laundry gets

Politicians need to balance what their constituents, the voters, want done, versus what their rich campaign contribution funders want. It's a tough Public Relations act where either group can throw them out. I've oft compared political campaigns to the selling of candidates as if they were laundry detergents, hence my joke, "Meet the new Low-Phosphate Biodegradable Governor." This contains such observations as CityBeat's John R. Lamb calling his column "Spin Cycle", which is both a political term and a laundry machine feature. As for myself, 55 years as an editor warrants one of my nicknames, "Permanent Press", and that is also a laundry setting.

In addition, political campaigns launder money in one form or another, usually legally, often taking cash from Special Interests and then granting them a sympathetic ear in return. Doesn't always work out, however, because politics is a crapshoot, heavy on the crap.

Getting on to San Diego's Mayor, Kevin Faulconer, he was unable to sell voters on a new downtown football stadium, a new Mission Valley stadium, easy conversion of housing to vacation rentals, Soccer City, and a Convention Center expansion. All were bad ideas, but none of them were his ideas.

He's just the messenger. He's the minister giving a sermon. He has this flaw when he preaches to San Diegans that is called "honesty". If Faulconer is supposed to sell us something, but he also knows it's a big pile of crap that is Welfare For Billionaires, you can sense that in his speech.

One of his predecessors, Mayor Jerry Sanders, talked the voters into approving Petco Park, and now the voters know that they were had and robbed. Once bitten twice shy. Voters don't want to get used again. We needed a new stadium for baseball, but putting it downtown was a really bad choice. It adds to overcrowding, traffic congestion, and parking problems, making matters worse than they already were. You can't even take a bus to a Padres game, because all the busses are re-routed away from the stadium due to traffic tie-ups.

The biggest problem with Petco Park however wasn't that it was a taxpayer give-away to wealthy Major League Baseball billionaires, but rather that it created 4,000 homeless downtown, tearing down the \$30 a week hotels they stayed in. Nearly all of them are still homeless, now over ten years later. You don't care? Do you care about all the piss and shit on the sidewalks? Do you care about tons and tons of garbage and its cleanup cost? Do you care about investors black-balling San Diego as a place to transact business?

After Mayor Sanders and Petco Park, it looks to me like voters have had enough spending hype, so Mayor Faulconer had no chance to sell anybody anything. Sanders became chief of the Chamber of Commerce, presiding over our failing economy, failing housing market, failing tourism, and like all of us watching San

Diego businesses slide slowly into bankruptcy. Las Vegas ended up renting out million-dollar condos to homeless people for \$90 a week. 80% of our downtown condos have not sold and never will, of course, but the markups are so high that the industry still sees over a billion dollars a week in profits, after

So, Mayor Failure? Nobody could have done a better job backing billionaire-take-all strategies, even though the voters knew it was all bullshit. Faulconer's a politician, not a magician. He's been really good at the City's "sleight of hand" tricks, the City Department of Propaganda (that's Communications and Public Relations, for those of you outsiders to the PR biz). Methinks our screwed-up city could be even worse under a few other mayoral possibilities. Mayor Bob Filner could possibly have done better, but his sexual misconduct issues prevented that. How about Barbara Bry for Mayor in 2020? If she can get the backing from both the poor and the billionaires at the same time, San Diego wins. And, of course, we are San Diego.

News Media News:

This section deals with things that both affect the poor and the news media at the same time.

We will all miss Don Bauder, who retired from the San Diego Reader recently.

Gary Warth in the San Diego Union-Tribune had an article called "Homeless Count Down", which we consider misleading. It refers to the last-Thursday-of-the-month count of downtown sidewalk homeless, and the count findings in July were 926, August 964, and only 787 in September. That is all 880, plus or minus 100 or so. Homeless get better at hiding, and the count did not include the 100+ homeless that crossed the trolley tracks, now living outside of the count zone. So, the 787 count is at least 887 if you expand the count territory by a block or two, allowing for the homeless migration. Still that is down by 77, not 177. We lose more than that to suicides every couple of months. (See editorial "City of Death", near the beginning of this page.)

San Diego can be absolutely proven to have 19,000 homeless, and that provable number will reach 20,000 by the end of the year in ten weeks. There are another 15,000 as well, which are known to exist but cannot be proven because of how intelligent they are and how well they are able to hide. I am in that group of 15 thousand, because I have NEVER been counted, except one year when I demanded same. Total homeless, 35 thousand, best data available, as of Dec. 31, 2018.

4 thousand in shelters, 5 thousand counted on the sidewalk, 2 thousand in jail and not counted, 9 thousand well-hidden who asked for help and identified themselves publicly and are not in any other count anywhere, and 15 thousand who keep their homelessness entirely secret and will not talk to anybody about it under any circumstances whatsoever. They would rather die or kill you instead.

The huge money used for help will help no one except the homeless who are drug abusers, mentally ill, criminals, veterans, or several other categories, but that is only about 10 thousand in all of those categories combined. The other 25 thousand homeless in San Diego have no help planned for them at all. Grant money is used for not-needed and not-welcome professional services, such as psychiatry, psychology, case management, probation, parole, and other forms of control, not housing.

Gary Warth also had an article Oct. 4, "SD Receives \$14.1 Million for Homeless Services", and that is state money, HEAP, Homeless Emergency Aid Program, all of which will be used to continue failed programs, not build any housing. Money will be used for Outreach Harassment, which causes homeless to commit suicide, and there will be attempts at "placement" of homeless into housing which does not exist. There will also be Street Cleaning harassment, also a big cause of suicides, as well as Rapid Rehousing, which does not work because the lowest rental unit price that has not been torn down by City Redevelopment costs \$1,700 a month to rent, and that is about equal to how much a person earns at Minimum Wage, working full-time. The money wasted will increase how many homeless are stranded in the circus tents. San Diego is said to have 7% of California's homeless, but the years of Repression here have made our homeless experts at hiding, so the figure is probably twice its official amount.

California, of course, has more homeless in reality than the other 49 states combined, and there are about a dozen reasons for this, which will eventually warrant an editorial in this paper.

Justice Kavenaugh? It is over, and the fine nation I grew up in is dead. This becomes a Great Depression, then a Civil War, and ends up nuclear. Sad. All my life I have been plagued by knowing too much about the future.

The Electoral Paradox: Both candidates suck, but people are not willing to go to the polls just to vote the worst one out.

Ryan Bradford of CityBeat and his editorial on being poisoned at Del Taco: As an Editorialist you have to be careful where you eat and drink. Some of the time these things are intentional, but for 30 years I denied there was anything going on like that, and was proven wrong. Nearly died a couple of times, too. Welcome to the club. Journalists being poisoned should always be reported to an intelligence investigation group, as a precaution. As I always say, Welcome To Reality.

Greg Palast (BBC): The State of Indiana unlawfully purged (removed) nearly all of its poor and/or Black voters from voter registration lists. https://mailchi.mp/gregpalast/indiana-caught-illegallypurging-20000-voters-are-you-one From Election Scam Clearinghouse on Facebook. • There is a man on a Secret Facebook page who claims that certain bacteria are intentionally being circulated in San Diego, and that these bacteria target those who are old, weak, disabled, or have compromised immune systems from HIV. He claims that a form of Desulfotomaculum, a weaponized version (nigrificans) is one of the bacteria being used. This could cause 50 million cases of Hepatitis A. •

Current business involves the Transportation Justice Working Group, working with MTS to try to help those denied a Disabled bus pass, plus those who cannot afford transit, and now with a focus on City Heights youth and the late buses and overcrowding in Black areas. NOTE: EMERGENCY REGARDING THE MTS FARE INCREASE FOR SENIORS HAD NOT YET BEEN REPORTED. • Rachel's Center for homeless women has been handing out flyers. One warns that Fentanyl is being mixed in with Methamphetamine or Crack and resulting in overdoses. The other warns that Black Tar Heroin is being contaminated with Botulism. Since part of my Ph.D. training was on unlawful drugs, I told the group that Black Tar Heroin is the Mexican type, sometimes referred to as "Mud", and Botulism is a bacterium that survives boiling water, so "curing" the heroin by boiling it before injection will NOT stop that bacterium. Botulism produces Botox, which can kill someone injecting it. As for adding Fentanyl to "speed" drugs, it is also being added to marijuana, as is heroin or opiates, to increase drug addiction.
